Camp Schedule

Safety & Tool Basics

Day one focuses on tool use and how to protect our bodies when using different tools.

Design

Day two the participants will learn about the design process and what goes into creating something from beginning to end.

Build

Day three the participants will continue on what they've learned and get into the hands-on activities related to building.

Finish

Day four focuses on completing the build and putting finishing touches, like paint and siding, on the project.

Under the guidance of SCC Professor, Dave Brokl, and with the support of knowledgeable camp leaders, the participants will work together with their peers on an exciting project that will go to a good home.







Camp Rules

Attendance: If you're child is unable to attend or will be late, reach out to YWCA staff as soon as possible.

Check In, Check Out: All campers must be checked in and checked out in person by an adult. No child will be allowed to get in a car without being checked out first. Adult must present photo ID to check out camper and must be listed as an approved pick up person.

Phone use: Campers will keep their cell phones, if they have them, on their person. Phone use will be limited, however. Please reach out to YWCA staff during camp hours if needed.

Volunteers will serve as camp guides and will be charged with leading and accounting for their group of 4 campers. Campers will be accompanied by their camp guide for restroom breaks, along with at least one other camper.

Campers must be able to follow directions and be mindful of others and the space.

These rules were created to ensure the campers are safe and that they have fun while learning how to use tools, build and design.
